


3	Monitoring Symptoms	All staff and students must self-screen at home each day before leaving for school. COVID Symptoms include: Fever/chills, Cough, Shortness of breath/difficulty breathing, Fatigue, Muscle/body aches, Headache, New loss of taste/smell, Sore throat, Congestion/runny nose, Nausea/vomiting & Diarrhea.	<u>CDPH</u> ₄
	Masks: Schools	Outdoors - Masks are optional outdoors for all students and staff and recommended outdoors while in crowded areas	CDPH ₂ CalOSHA ₂
		Indoors - Masks are required for all students and staff in all classroom and school non-classroom settings, including hallways, school offices, restrooms, gyms, auditoriums, etc. Acceptable Masks include double-layer cloth masks and disposable hospital masks. Bandanas and gaiter masks are not acceptable. Masks are Available for anyone who forgets or loses theirs	<u>CDPH</u> ₄
		School Buses - Masks are required on school buses	CDPH ₂
	Distancing	There are no distancing requirements for the classroom, but we are setting up classrooms to encourage spacing. On school buses, space between all occupants will be maximized, and open windows to the greatest extent practicable. Two windows on a bus should be opened fully at a minimum.	<u>CDPH</u> ₄
	Ventilation	Ventilation at all SCCS sites has been evaluated, and meets or exceeds recommendations from the CDC and CDPH.	Calosha ₂ CDPH ₄
	Cleaning & Disinfecting	Staff and students will clean frequently-touched surfaces at school and continue frequent handwashing and sanitizing. Buses will be thoroughly cleaned daily. All buses, facilities & rooms that have had a person with COVID-19 symptoms within the last 24 hours will receive additional cleaning & disinfecting.	<u>CDPH</u> ₄
	Isolation	Students or staff with COVID-19 symptoms or who test positive for COVID-19 must isolate. If symptoms occur at school, students will be kept in a care room until picked up by their caregivers. Students & Staff may return to school when: 1. At least 24 hours have passed since resolution of fever without the use of fever-reducing medications; and 2. Other symptoms have disappeared; and 3. They have a negative PCR test for COVID, OR a healthcare provider has confirmed an alternative diagnosis, OR at least 10 days have passed since symptom onset.	CDPH ₄

	 undergo at least twice weekly testing during the 10-day quarantine; and continue to quarantine for all extracurricular activities at school, including sports, and activities within the community setting. 	
Quarantine after exposure without a mask	Unvaccinated students must quarantine if they are exposed to a COVID-19 positive case when one or both parties were <u>not wearing a mask</u> . Quarantine can end after Day 10 from the date of last exposure without testing; OR Quarantine can end after Day 7 if a diagnostic specimen is collected after Day 5 from the date of last exposure and tests negative. Asymptomatic close contacts must continue to self-monitor for symptoms through day 14 from last known exposure. If any symptoms develop during this 14 day period, they must immediately isolate, get tested and contact their healthcare provider.	<u>CDPH</u> ₄


